CLASS INFORMATION

Red Cross Pet First Aid: Katrina Schou, Centennial Animal Services: A four hour pet first aid certification course that teaches participants emergency care procedures for cats and dogs. Upon completion of practical skills test and course, students will receive certification in Red Cross Pet First Aid.

Professionalism: Todd Regan, Arvada PD. A presentation ethics and moral code in animal control.

Handling and Assessment of Parrots: Julie Weiss Murad, The Gabriel Foundation. Discover how to be prepared for parrots in the field and in emergency situations with a focus on what is species appropriate for food, husbandry, and housing.

CLASS INFORMATION

Animal Abuse: An Overview of Current Research for Human and Animal Welfare Professionals: Dr. Frank Ascione and Dr. Philip Tedeschi, University of Denver. A presentation on the correlation between animal abuse and human violence such as child abuse and domestic violence.

Necropsy Techniques and How to Use Pathology for Forensic

Evidence: Dr. Terry Spraker, CSU. This presentation will cover necropsy techniques for collection of evidence as well as cover a few cases seen at CSU.

Preparing Yourself for Dog Encounters: Hector Hernandez, First Class Dog Training. This demonstration will prepare you for a dog encounter by reacting to the dog's body language and responding accordingly with the least amount of injury to the you and the dog.

Virology Lab Tour: Tour of the Colorado Dept. of Health lab where they test for rabies. *****PLEASE NOTE: WE WILL MEET AT THE LAB 8100 Lowry Blvd, Denver, CO AT 8:00 AM – ATTENDEES ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THEIR OWN TRANSPORTATION TO AND FROM THE LAB!**

Animal Emergency Management: Deborah Colburn, Director of the Colorado Veterinary Medical Foundation's Animal Emergency Management Program. This program will provide attendees with critical information on establishing and enhancing animal emergency response operations

Approach to Suspected Toxicities: Dr. Dwayne Hamar, CSU. This class provides a general approach to suspected toxicities and information on common toxicants used for malicious poisonings.

Rabies in Colorado: Dr. Elisabeth Lawaczeck, State Public Health Veterinarian. A presentation on the topic of rabies and the state of rabies in Colorado.

Animal Cruelty Investigations: Jim Boller, Code 3. An informational course on understanding animal cruelty and a general awareness of the issue.

Reptiles in Colorado: Community Concerns and Community

Resources: Reptiles are part of our communities – for sale in pet stores, cared for in shelters, and in private homes as pets. This class will take a look at what the reptile trade in Colorado looks like, how it affects our communities, what a reptile needs from an animal control officer, as well as have a chance to meet some common reptiles.

Equipment Training and ACO Olympics: Learn techniques from experienced animal control officers for tools such as the control pole, snappy snare, and trap setting. After the lessons, the fun begins with the inaugural run of the “ACO Olympics.”
